

Is Your Television Ready for June 13?

Televisions are going under major changes on June 13.

If your new or old television is connected to cable or satellite you are ready. If you however are going to use an outside antenna, there are still some things to do.

The first thing is to determine if a converter box is necessary. If your television or VCR was made in the past 3 years you do not need one. Older televisions and VCRs will need a converter box to tune in the new digital signals. The box will connect with the antenna and the TV or VCR. The old tuner will be set to channel 3 or 4 and does not change. Follow the directions to set up a converter box with your set and have it scan for all available channels. The box is now your tuner and here is where you now change channels.

On June 13 you will again have to go into the television or converter box menu to scan for channels. Some will change and some will no longer be there. You also may notice that some channels you once received are no longer available. This could be because the digital pattern is different than the old analog. You might also want to try tuning your converter box on a cloudy day as you might receive more signals than on a clear day.

Mary's Corner – by Mary Thaman

Those of us who are older know how fast time goes so don't look now, but half of 2009 is almost over! I try not to dwell on this and hopefully, you don't either!

Many older people eat at senior centers around the county and that noon meal is the big one of the day. I'm often asked why I don't eat at the Bryan Center. The reason is that I'm home cooking and testing recipes for Mary's Memo and the newsletter.

This month's recipe was adapted from a Paula Deen one. I'm very anti-MSG and you'd be hard pressed to find a bouillon cube that doesn't contain it. So instead of using a beef bouillon cube, I replaced a cube with 1 teaspoon of a product called Better than Bouillon that doesn't contain MSG. When you slip the onion out of the foil packet, you'll think you're eating French onion soup. I should know because I love French onion soup no matter how it's made!

BAKED-IN-FOIL FRENCH ONION SOUP

1 medium size sweet onion (flatter ones are sweetest), peeled

1 teaspoon Better than Bouillon

1 dab of butter (about 1 teaspoon)

Heavy duty foil

Parmesan cheese (optional)

Hollow out top of peeled onion enough to hold Better than Bouillon and butter (about 1 1/4-inch by 1 1/4-inch). Seal securely in heavy duty foil. Bake in 350oF. oven for 1 hour 15 minutes. Open one end of foil and slip onion and juice into a soup bowl. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese if you like. It's delicious!


